- Start and finish location next to the Railway Station. Note the history of the site including the gaol.
- View down the main street from the church. Turn and look west towards the boat ramp, scout hall and other community infrastructure within easy walking distance.

- 4. Note the environmental issues and the historic markers along the path.
- 5. Note the buildings and the businesses along the main street look at the building design.
