<p>Signs and bags about dog droppings – becoming a real issue – some signage to direct and also some bags for the dog droppings would be beneficial.</p>	<p>Signage on the football ground will be investigated as dogs are prohibited on recreation grounds.</p>	<p>SAM</p>	<p>Dogs are prohibited from sporting grounds under the Dog Control Act 2000. A review of the signage at Heybridge recreation ground was undertaken and as a result, an upgrade of the signage present has been recommended to clearly communicate this regulation to visitors. Subsequently, it has been deemed inappropriate to install dog waste bags in an area where dogs are not permitted. For the convenience of dog owners, waste bags are available at Preservation Bay, where dogs are permitted. This ensures dog owners have appropriate access to waste disposal options while adhering to the regulations in place.</p>
