The Big Room have been planting and growing some vegetables and herbs. We started with a walk to Becks Hardware to buy some parsley and spring onion plants to plant in a tub. The children were then given the opportunity to grow some snow peas from seeds. They have been observing the peas growing in the pots until big enough to replant to the climbing frame. The children helped to plant the peas and have been helping to water and observe the peas climbing up the frame. Two cucumber plants have been added, and we are planning to have two tomato plants as well.
