Welcome back to all our children and families! To all of our new families that have commenced care for this year, it is lovely to see the children settling into the Centre and building relationships with our educators, forming a sense of belonging.

Recently we had the Toddler room shade structure over the sandpit replaced and a new shade sail installed, this is providing much needed extra shade to this area. The hut that was moved from the Young Endeavour room has been relocated to the Toddler room outdoor bark area. The relocated cubby house has been a welcome addition with the children delighting in role play and creating their own desired games.





Leading up to the Easter break we will be organising, in conjunction with the Ulverstone Secondary College Community Services class a whole Centre excursion to Anzac Park. The students will organise an Easter egg hunt and some activities for the children to engage in, we will then have a shared lunch before returning to the Centre. The Young Endeavour children will be visiting our local neighbours in the independent living units, this has become an annual tradition that our elderly neighbours look forward to.

**Staff training** ..... Our educators have been updating First Aid qualifications, annual CPR and food safety updates. Staff from the long day care service have had training on diabetes awareness, which was very informative. At the end of March staff from each room in the centre and all of our OSHC services have the opportunity to attend behaviour management trainings, relating to developing emotional regulation skills in individuals with anxious, oppositional and aggressive behaviour.

Fundraising....The centre will be holding an Easter raffle with books being distributed at the end of March and drawn on Thursday the 18th April. We will be participating in the 'Entertainment Book' fundraiser again in 2019. The new books will be available for purchase after the launch in late April for early bird purchases. The centre receives \$13 form each book purchased either in book form or digital copies. Our fundraising supports the centre to purchase new resources. 
**Big Room News....**Welcome to all the children and families joining our room for this year. The children have been enjoying picking snow peas and cucumbers from our vegetable garden wall, eating and tasting them at afternoon tea time.

The creative arts has been a focus in our room, which has included, potato masher, shaving foam, wicker ball, feet and finger painting.

At group time the children are enjoying listening, watching and reading 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' on the iPad. They are developing an awareness of the life cycle of the caterpillar changing into a butterfly from a cocoon.
