


With Christmas



## Before School Care... Colour mixing paints




While children assisted with the preparing and making of paints during Before School Care discussions

## Policies reviewed Sept/Oct......

- Recently the service has reviewed our Medical Conditions Policy and Risk Minimisation Plan in line with Regulation 90 of the Education and Care Services National Regulations. This regulation requires a risk-minimisation plan for the management of medical conditions for children in care, including a communication plan. It is a critical condition of our service that parents complete the risk minimisation plan for children with any medical conditions in order for the service to have full written details on the care and treatment of each child's medical needs. Parents are also required to complete the communication section of the form whenever changes occur regarding their child's condition.
- All educators recently participated in an updated child protection training session. It was a valuable session, providing educators with the knowledge and access to support services. There is a new advice and referral website, Strong Families, Safe Kids, and 1800 phone number for any person, including children, families, guardians, and professionals who may wish to seek advice, support or guidance around child safety and protection.
