












Excursions to Ulverstone Secondary College

Children in the Big Room have been participating in various gross motor physical play experiences. During group time they enjoyed exploring their movement skills to a Kids Yoga routine based on a story about 'Moana' and the ocean. Other activities included rope jumping, ball throwing through a hoop in the tree and bean bag throwing into hoops







Over the last couple of months the children have been developing their fine motor skills using tongs to select and pick up their own fruit. There has been a great improvement in their ability to manipulate the tongs.











Toddler Room news...

During the past couple of months in the Toddler Room we have been exploring our literacy skills and making meaning though art. We have been reading The Hungry Caterpillar book and listening to an online animated reading of The Hungry Caterpillar. This was followed on with creating some beautiful, colourful butterflies using water droppers and paper towel. We also created a tin caterpillar which we could place various foods into its mouth as the story was read to us. This helped us to develop our fine motor skills and listening skills. 
